General Comments		<ul> <li>Customs only authorises the export of used household goods and personal effects.</li> <li>Some of the prohibited items are work tools, large machinery, live plants, pornography, alcohol and non-perishable food that have to be checked quantity and destiny, collection of coins or other etc.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>For all types of customers:</li> <li>In sea shipments, after the local agent picks up the empty container from the terminal and sends the markings to the customs broker with all the documentation, it takes 2-3 days approx. to complete the customs clearance for the shipment to go out.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>In air shipment, after we send the AWB to the customs broker with all the documentation, it takes 2 days to complete the customs clearance for the shipment to go out.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>In road shipment, after we advise the customs broker of the crossing date, it takes</li> <li>2 days to complete customs clearance for the shipment to go out.</li> </ul>

Once the shipment has departed, the Customs Broker presents the bill of lading to Customs and requests the return of the original letter of guarantee that we must give to the shipper/account. The shipper must present it at the corresponding bank to cancel it.</li> <li>For the export of paintings, customs require an authorization for the export, this needs to be done online to the Comisión de Patrimonio, Ministry of Education and Culture.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This refers to foreign individuals (without diplomatic rank) who do not have a Uruguayan identity card that proves their legal residence and entered the country under a customs file that includes, among other documents, a list and a bank guarantee.</li> <li>The DJ form is only required for ocean shipments.</li> </ul>

This procedure is free of charge and is usually completed within 1 week.

This procedure is free of charge and is usually completed	Refers to foreign citizens with diplomatic rank, accredited to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It includes Foreign Embassies and International Organizations with a Mission in our country.

Motor Vehicles – Foreign Citizens	Document of the owner of the vehicle and public or private document as proof of ownership of the vehicle. Any document of how the vehicle has been acquired or customs file of entry of it to our country.		
Motor Vehicles – Uruguayan Citizens	Document of the owner of the vehicle and public or private document as proof of ownership of the vehicle. Any document of how the vehicle has been acquired or customs file of entry of it to our country.		
Motor Vehicles – Foreign or Uruguayan Diplomats	<ul> <li>Document of the owner of the vehicle and public or private document as proof of ownership of the vehicle. Any document of how the vehicle has been acquired or customs file of entry of it to our country.</li> <li>Diplomatic Note authorising exportation of the vehicle.</li> <li>In case of old vehicles of more than 30 or 50 years, a Patrimony procedure will be required with front and side photo of the car and valuation of it.</li> </ul>		
Other Vehicles (moto, water vehicle)	Same as motor vehicles.

Wedding trousseau	No special inconvenient, it is considered as clothing.		
Inheritance	<ul> <li>Not possible at Uruguay</li> <li>Inheritance removal has to be sent with a usual used HHG export customs procedure.</li> </ul>		
New furniture and household goods			Consult your local agent
Works of Art & Antiques		<ul> <li>For the export of paintings, customs requires to make a procedure before the patrimony commission.</li> <li>This procedure is only required for paintings by foreign or deceased Uruguayan authors, has a cost and is usually completed within a week.</li> <li>Paintings painted by living Uruguayan authors do not require this procedure.</li> <li>Customs also requires this procedure for sculptures but in this case there is no cost.</li> <li>PARA DIPLOMATICOS: For the export process, customs require that the patrimony commission issue a note of exoneration of the paintings and sculptures carried by the diplomat. This procedure is free of charge and is usually completed within 1 week.</li> </ul>	
Precious metal objects (jewellery, coins)		<ul> <li>High value Jewellery is not covered by Insurance – it is recommended not to include in the shipment.</li> <li>Collection of coins - no inconvenient.</li> </ul>

Household appliances			No inconvenient
Electrical appliances			No inconvenient but need to be checked with the proper destination, and also with the airline in case of an air shipment.
Carpets			No inconvenient
Presents & Souvenirs			No inconvenient. Consult your local agent in case of huge quantity.
Wine, Alcohol		Maximum 12 boxes with 12 bottles each.     Needs to be checked with the airline in case air shipment.	
Machines, appliances, spare parts	In case of great quantity of tools or big size machines, a profession certificate of the owner will be necessary and special export customs procedure.		
Tins and food		Not allowed. it needs to be checked for kitchen leftovers.	
Prohibited Items		Pornography items, drugs, specific medicines, alive plants

Firearms and sport guns	<ul> <li>Armament's Guide of arms</li> <li>In case of collection of guns, the owner has to be registered as collector</li> </ul>		
Cats and Dogs	<ul> <li>Official Health Certificate: Issued by the official Health Authority where the pet lives. It is valid for 10 days and must be valid until arrival at the destination.</li> <li>Documents needed to request the Health Certificate:         <ul> <li>Health Certificate from a licensed veterinarian with a professional stamp.</li> <li>A photo clearly identifying the animal.</li> <li>Note for the US: The Health Certificate must certify the absence of SCREWWORM (Chocliomyia hominivorax).</li> </ul> </li> <li>Health Certificates</li> <li>International Certificate for sending domestic dogs and cats to MERCOSUR states.</li> <li>For the EU:         <ul> <li>Official Health Certificate: Issued by the official Health Authority where the pet lives. Valid for 10 days and must be valid until arrival at the destination.</li> <li>Veterinary Certificate: For noncommercial movement of dogs, cats, and ferrets to the EU.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Rabies Vaccination:         <ul> <li>Pets must be at least 12 weeks old at the time of vaccination.</li> <li>The vaccine must meet the requirements of Annex III to Regulation (EU) No 576/2013.</li> <li>At least 21 days must have passed since</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	the primary vaccination before travel.  • A certified copy of the vaccination details must be attached to the health certificate.  • Rabies Antibody Test:  • Sample taken by an authorized veterinarian at least 30 days after the primary vaccination.  • Must be done within a current valid vaccination series and at least 3 months before travel.  • Antibody level must be equal to or greater than 0.5 IU/ml.  • Certified by an official laboratory report, attached to the health certificate.  • No renewal needed if the pet is revaccinated within the valid period of the initial and subsequent vaccinations.		
Fumigation of imported and exported wooden Crates	Wood must have Fumigation stamp
