The client must sign the application form with the details provided by the mover and transfer the application to the MFA or to the employer who will sign it and return it to back to the moving company in charge. This process might take 1 up to 30 days. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All personal effects imported into Burkina Faso are subject to UEMOA tax: 1.3% of CIF* value. The client must be present in Burkina Faso when the goods arrive in the country (Contact your moving agent for more information). Approximate timeframes (for all categories of shippers): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sea freight: 7-16 days from Terminal Ouagadougou to residence Ouagadougou Air freight: 7 days from Airport Ouagadougou to residence Ouagadougou Extra fees estimated: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The first 10 days are free of charge for sea consignments and 7 days free for air consignment. For airfreight, the fees will then be calculated according to the weight. For containers, demurrage fees will be CFA 75 000 per day, calculated from the 10th day. Fees are for the client's account (this also applies to diplomats). For containers terminal fees will apply from the 10th day. For all expatriates (except diplomats): 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All vehicles must be brought to the CCVA (vehicle road worthiness office) and to the BVA (motor vehicle customs bureau) by the client or the person authorised to act on their behalf. At the end of the import clearance all vehicles will be handed over at BVA park, unless special request for transportation to residence.
